Last week, at the <u>Venice Biennale</u>, the <u>Curry Stone Design Prize</u> (<u>@currystoneprize</u>) announced its three finalists. Each year, the prize is given to an enterprising designer who harnesses the power of design for social good. This year's finalists are Maya Pedal, an organization that turns used bicycles into pedal-powered sources of electricity, Elemental, a Chilean design firm that's rebuilding shanty towns with smart floor plans, and <u>Sustainable Health Enterprises</u>, which designs feminine hygiene products made from locally-sourced Rwandan banana fiber.
