## Winners selected for design prize

The Bend-based Curry Stone Foundation announced Tuesday the five winners of the 2012 Curry Stone Design Prize.

For their work as social design pioneers, the winners will each receive \$25,000, according to a news release. They also will be honored at an awards ceremony scheduled for Nov. 15 at the Harvard Graduate School of Design.

The Curry Stone Design Prize seeks to “champion designers as a force for social change,” according to the news release.

For 2012, the fifth year for the prize, five winners were chosen. They are: Center for Urban Pedagogy, Brooklyn, N.Y.; Liter Of Light, Manila, Philippines; Model of Architecture Serving Society, or MASS Design, Boston; Riwaq, Ramallah, Palestinian territories and Jeanne van Heeswijk, Rotterdam, Netherlands.

The prize is named for Bend residents Clifford Curry, an architect who has been recognized for his work in senior housing, and Delight Stone, an archaeologist and Curry’s wife. It’s managed out of the Curry Stone Foundation’s offices in downtown Bend.
